A new car park in the grounds of the Cirencester Rugby Football Club will be available for permit holders Monday to Friday and available for attendees of the Rugby club at the weekends. A new Cotswold District Council (Whiteway Car Park) (off-street parking places) Order 2020 will be established, to enable the regulation, charging and enforcement of the car park Monday to Friday.

Briefly describe it aims and objectives

Cotswold District Council has entered into a lease agreement with Cirencester Rugby Football Club to for the provision of additional parking to serve Cirencester.

The new car park will provide decant parking during the construction phase of the proposed Waterloo decked car park and for longer term permit-holder parking.

The Council has no statutory obligation to provide car parking. The Council is delivering additional parking capacity in response to the needs of all motorists but the Whiteway Car Park will specifically address the needs of businesses and workers who drive in to the town and need to park all day. The Car Park will provide 151 standard bays, 4 electrical vehicle charging bays, 3 wider bays for blue badge holders, and 5 motor cycle bays.
