

Public Consultation on Draft Corporate Strategy 2016-2019

Consultation on the draft Corporate Strategy has been carried out following the approval of the draft in September 2015. The results are as follows:

Overview and Scrutiny Committee - 1st December 2015

The Council's Overview and Scrutiny Committee considered the document at its Meeting on 1st December 2015 and agreed the Corporate Strategy, noting that some of the objectives and key tasks would be slightly amended before the Strategy was finalised to reflect the latest position.

Other Comments
