Background Information

1. The Leisure and Cultural Services Contract commenced on 31st July 2013 and expires on the 30th July 2023. There also exists the option to extend the contract for a further period of up to 3 years beyond the expiry date. A minimum notice period of 12 months applies if this option is taken.

2. The contract scope includes the following facilities:-

- Cirencester Leisure Centre
- Corinium Museum
- Bourton Leisure Centre
- Chipping Campden Leisure Centre.

3. The freehold of the sports centres at Fairford and Tetbury was transferred to the schools where they are located on 2nd January 2014.

4. The Contract is now in its sixth year, which provides the Council with the opportunity to review the performance of the contract in comparison with the original outsourcing strategy, the contract specification and the specified outcomes.

5. The Officers' suggested scope for the review is:-

- Performance to date set against the management contract outcomes.
- Financial performance set against the leisure management contractor's projections.
- Former Council owned/operated sites (Fairford and Tetbury) performance since transferring set against the grant agreement outcomes.
- Opportunities for capital investment from the leisure management contractor as part of a contract extension.

6. The outcome of the review also provides an opportunity to inform any decisions that Members may make in respect of a contract extension and/or the scope and procurement strategy for the next contract.
