04	18/04324/FUL	Case Officer - i) Officers would like to bring it to the attention of Members that the reason for referral within the report states 'N/A'. This is an oversight and the reasons for referral given by the Ward Member, Cllr. Fowles, are that, given the support from the Parish Council and from the community, he's requested that this application is brought to Committee for determination;
		ii) At the time of writing the Schedule report, Officers had not received any comments from the Parish Council. However, comments have now been received and have been included within the Additional Pages. The applicant has also provided information from the Parish Council meeting held on 10th December 2018 when the application was considered (item 6), which can also be found within the Additional Pages for this Committee Meeting;
		iii) Five comments of support have been submitted by members of the public and are available to view in full within the Additional Pages;
		iv) Since the completion of the Schedule report, the applicant has now provided further information, which relates to the health of her parents and the reasons why this informs the form and design of the proposed extension. Due to the

		personal nature of the additional information, officers have attached it on confidential pink pages to the Additional Pages. Although the use of planning conditions, where they would limit the benefit of the planning permission to a particular person or group of people, is rarely appropriate (as stated within the Planning Practice Guidance: Use of Planning Conditions (paragraph: 015 Reference ID: 21a-015-20140306), the Officer Recommendation to refuse the application, for the reason explained in the Schedule report, was very finely balanced and the additional information now provided is material to the consideration of the proposal. As a result of the additional information, officers recognise the genuine need for the size and form of the extension in this instance and consider that the balance can now be tilted towards the acceptability of the proposals, without the need for a personalised permission. On this basis, and on balance of all the material considerations, Officers now recommend that the application should be approved.

Case Officer - i) Officers would like to bring it to the attention of Members that the reason for referral within the report states 'None'. This is an oversight and the reasons for referral given by the Chairman of the Planning Committee are that, Cotswold District Council should be encouraging revenue into the Rural economy and the new sign is positioned to allow motorists to locate the business. 




We are also fully aware of Mrs Sleights' personal circumstances regarding the need for additional accommodation so that she can accommodate and care for her elderly and infirm parents.



I am writing to give my support to the planning application that Ms Carolyn Sleight has made to extend her property in Poulton (ref. 18/04324/FUL).



1. Apologies for absence.

Apologies for late arrival were received from Cllr. Fowles.

2. Approval of Minutes.


The Minutes of the meeting held on the 8th October 2018 were approved and signed.

3. County Councillor's Report.

Richard Gray has returned to work and a site meeting will be arranged between Gloucestershire Highways and the Chairman at the Ranbury bridge.

Cllr. Young asked the County Councillor about the feasibility of having a disabled parking bay on Cricklade Street for customers of the Village Hub. Cllr. Parsons said that there is no money available but he would discuss the proposition with Richard Gray.

The issue of parking on the slip road opposite The Falcon was discussed as it was felt that it is becoming an increasingly dangerous occurrence. It was reported that three cars were parked along the slip road with no space available for two way traffic. Cllr. Parsons said that a traffic regulation order would be needed to stop customers of The Falcon from parking in such a hazardous nature.

5. Budget and setting of annual precept for 2019/20.

The Councillors discussed the proposed budget produced by Cllr. Heneghan and the costs regarding the village cemetery.

The Councillors resolved to set the precept at £8,000 in order to facilitate the accrual of monies for the village cemetery.


6. Planning.

The Councillors thanked Ms Sleight for attending the meeting to discuss her planning application. The Councillors discussed the application and supported the application.

The garage at The Chapel has been converted into accommodation without planning permission. This property is in the Conservation Area and the Clerk was asked to write to the Enforcement Officer regarding this matter.

7. Report back on Flooding Meeting.

Helen Richard of GRCC has looked at all the items reviewed 2-3 years ago and has spoken to the Environment Agency regarding maintenance. There was a lot of frustration with Thames Water and the Chairman noted that a loss of local knowledge has not helped. The work to install the bund will commence shortly and the stream clearance.



8. Village Hub.

The Parish Council received an invitation to attend the stakeholders meeting. Cllr. Thomas attended on behalf of the Council. A plan to have hardstanding on the playground was rejected by the Councillors. No planning application has been received to date on which to comment. The Councillors will await the feedback from the Conservation Officer regarding the drystone wall to the rear of the Village Hall. A decision on the application is expected during January. The Councillors agreed with the concept of the Village Hub but will await the plans in due course. The Chairman reminded the Councillors that they needed to make their opinions known to the Clerk on this application in order to have a balanced view from the Council as a whole.

9. District Councillor's Report.

The proceeds of the sale of books amounting to £63 was given to the Clerk to deposit in the Current account, this money will go towards the £240 costs of maintenance on the war memorial.

A brief of the consultation of the Local Plan is expected in 2020. The Park and Stride scheme located at the Rugby Club is being disputed by the Chester-Masters so a delay has occurred. Additional car parking is being looked into on the Tetbury Road.

The Old Hospital is to be demolished and additional car parking spaces made.

Following the closure of House of Frazer, interest has been shown in the retail space by B&M and also Wetherspoons.

The new leader of CDC is Tony Berry from Kemble.


10. Any Other Business.

9. Conclusion

It is considered, that the cumulative impact of the proposed signage and previously approved signage would result in an over-proliferation of signage within the area, which is in an area of special advert control. The proposed additional signage therefore detracts from the local amenity of the surrounding area which is characterised by its rural landscape. The proposed works are considered not to accord with the objectives of Paragraph 132 of Section 12 of the NPPF.

10. Reason for Refusal:

The proposed sign would be within an area of Special Advert Control outside the built settlement of Poulton. By virtue of the location adjacent to a previously approved sign, the cumulative impact of the proposed signs would result in dispersed clutter thereby having a significant adverse impact on the amenity of the area, detracting from the visual appearance and rural character of the area, and as such would be contrary to paragraphs 124, 130 and 132 of Section 12 of the NPPF.
