- I. Members discussed that references to bowls were not made in the strategy despite being a popular sport in the Cotswolds. The Cabinet Member stated that the this was due to Sports England classification, and stated that a written explanation would be recirculated to Members.

- 3. Members requested further detail on the 14 projects within Crowdfund Cotswold.

### **Responses**

Q1: Members discussed that references to bowls were not made in the strategy despite being a popular sport in the Cotswolds. The Cabinet Member stated that the this was due to Sports England classification, and stated that a written explanation would be recirculated to Members.

Bowling greens weren't included in the Playing Pitch Strategy as non-pitch facilities, such as bowls and tennis are assessed using Sport England's Assessing Needs and Opportunities Guidance (2014). This requires a different methodology to assess supply and demand, to that used for pitch sports (e.g. football, rugby, cricket and hockey).

Officers have received no indications from bowls clubs or participants that additional green provision is needed in the district, therefore focus should be on increasing participation and improving or maintaining the current stock of bowling greens in the district.

An analysis of current supply of outdoor bowling green provision, through the Bowls England platform, indicates there are nine flat blowing green in Cotswold District. Suggesting there is sufficient provision to meet both current and future demands, as this figure is comparable to



other rural districts of Cotswold's size. Officers will continue to review the situation and will happily support clubs to explore aspirations in the form of facility development to ensure they can accommodate the existing membership but also future demand.

### **Recommendations from officers**

- Retain existing quantity of greens currently used for outdoor bowls.
- Assist clubs, where possible, with any future ancillary provision improvements (e.g. identifying funding sources)
- Support clubs with plans to increase membership so that growth can be maximised.

Q2: Members asked for the costs for the capital programme of work, including figures on the capital fund required to complete works and the quotes that were behind target on page 25 of the report.

Pg21 Section 4.5. Report states 'Capital programme of works to support the implementation of the new Leisure Management Contract, which include improvements to Cirencester and Bourton Leisure Centres.'

Q. Are there any detailed costs available for this?

Response: The Capital works are currently out to tender following design sign off in January 2024. The proposed works include new poolside play areas, new studio flooring, changing room refurbishments, a cycling studio and wellbeing gym for Cirencester, and a fully accessible changing room for Bourton. Full financial details of the final tender that is accepted can be made available but will not be shared publicly due to their commercial sensitivity. In delivering this project on behalf of Cotswold District Council, Freedom Leisure are tasked with staying within the allotted budget within the Capital Programme of £1.2M

Pg23 Section 5.9 Report states (highlight was the element referred to)

'However, the condition of the showers has proven to be so unreliable that this item of work had to be brought forward - which led to the SPSF bid option being compromised as the works need completing before an award has been made. The Council will still engage Freedom Leisure to complete the works using the Capital fund, but the timeframe needed to be shorter to minimise complaints'

Q. How Much?

Response: As stated in the report, this section only refers to shower replacements brought forward to improve the service. The cost for this was £9k, this sum was included in the overall Capital works package and will subsequently be a part of the allotted budget of £1.2M



### Question 3: Members requested further detail on the 14 projects within Crowdfund Cotswold.

Pg25 Section 5.18 Report States (highlight was the element referred to)

'In financial terms, the start of the mobilisation period has been slightly behind the target set in Freedom Leisure's bid. This has been influenced by a number of factors including:

- Starting numbers were lower than anticipated because of the exit approach from the previous contractor. There is always a risk when an incumbent contractor knows they will not be the future contract provider, that they reduce their proactive efforts to boost memberships and maintain or improve service levels.
- Memberships are close to expectations but there is a slightly lower yield, which causes a small shortfall in the income.

Q. Report says that the original quotes that won Freedom Leisure the contract, we are behind in terms of meeting those targets. How far behind are we?

Response: This section refers to the income being received by Freedom Leisure. At the time of compiling the report we had data from QI available (Aug to Oct 2023) Please see table below and accompanying commentary from FL.
