#### I. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") allows Applicants to apply for new Premises Licences, Premises Licence variations, Club Premises Certificates and Personal Licences. This Application is for a Premises Licence Variation.
- 1.2 The Application was received on 10<sup>th</sup> May 2023. Experimental Manor Amethyst Ltd ("the Applicant") is represented by Thomas & Thomas Partners LLP. The Licensing Authority is satisfied that the Application was duly made, the correct notification process was followed, and the Application was appropriately advertised.
- **1.3** The original hearing was supposed to be on the 18 April 2023, but was adjourned under regulation 11 which states:
  - —(I) Subject to regulation 13, an authority may extend a time limit provided for in these Regulations for a specified period where it considers this to be necessary in the public interest.
- 1.4 The adjournment was because in the circumstances it was considered necessary in the public interest to adjourn the hearing to allow the applicants solicitors to speak with persons who had submitted representations.
- **1.5** The Application seeks a Premises Licence Variation to the following licensable activities and times:
  - Supply by Retail of Alcohol Every day 08:00 02:00
     On and Off premises
     (Including Non-standard timings for residents and bona fide guests) 24 Hours.

#### With the addition of:

- Provision of Late-Night Refreshment Every day 23:00 02:00
   (Including Non-standard timings for residents and bona fide guests) 23:00 05:00
- Provision of Films Every day 00:00 00:00

The licensable activities and times are currently:

Supply by Retail of Alcohol Monday to Saturday 10:00 - 23:00
 On and Off premises



Supply by Retail of Alcohol Sunday 12:00 - 22:30

- Supply of Alcohol Monday to Saturday 10:00 23:00
- Supply of Alcohol Sunday 12:00 22:30

#### 2. SITE DESCRIPTION

**2.1** A copy of the site plan and location are attached at **Annex B**.

#### 3. AGREED CONDITIONS

- 3.1 If the Sub Committee is in agreement, the Applicant has suggested the following conditions:
  - No licensable activities may be provided in external areas or the grounds after I Ipm. After I Ipm licensable activities may only be provided internally within the hotel buildings.
  - The premises licence holder shall implement a parking and traffic management plan to manage the arrival and departure of guests without causing a nuisance local residents.

These conditions have been suggested by the applicant to alleviate the concerns raised by members of the public

#### 4. REPRESENTATIONS

- **4.1** Responsible Authorities under the Licensing Act 2003 No representations have been received from Responsible Authorities under the Licensing Act 2003
- 4.2 Residents Four (4) representations were received, with three (3) persons agreeing a hearing was not necessary and withdrawing their concerns after meetings held with the Applicant. One (1) representation and a person's concern remains outstanding and can be found in Annex C.



#### 5. NATIONAL GUIDANCE

- 5.1 The Secretary of State's Guidance (referred to as 'Section 182 Guidance) requires Licensing Authorities, following receipt of relevant representations, to make judgements about what constitutes public nuisance and what is necessary, in terms of conditions attached to a specific Premises Licence, to prevent it.
- **5.2** Where the Act provides for mandatory conditions to be included in a Premises Licence, it is the duty of the Licensing Authority issuing the Licence to include those conditions in the Licence.

#### 6. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

6.1 There are no financial implications arising directly from the consideration of this application. However, any appeal to the Magistrates' Court against the refusal of the Application or against the imposition of Conditions could result in the Council having to bear the legal costs of defending its decision.

#### 7. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

7.1 There is a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court within 21 days of the Council's decision should the Council refuse the Application or against the conditions imposed on the Licence.

In terms of specific **regulated entertainments** please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
  wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
  exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
  wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
  indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.


