Kemble and Ewen Parish Council wishes to lodge a strong objection to this application for modifications to the existing licences.

Ewen is a small and quiet village. The application site is at one end of the village within earshot of a number of residential properties and close to the village public house. The creation of noise from outside wedding celebrations represents an entirely incongruous activity, much out of place with the general character of the village and potentially causing unwelcome disturbance to a significant number of residential neighbours. In addition, the location of these activities within the site has been altered and is now centred at a new building which is nearer to the village.

The constraints of the existing licences go some way to recognising and managing these adverse features. They are also similar to those of the public house so that any nuisance ceases at the same time. The Parish Council considers the modifications proposed would create adverse and unacceptable conditions and should be refused .
