			Approx £30,000 of the Domestic Abuse New Burdens has been allocated to a		
			countywide officer and the remainder to providing a measure to increase		
			victims safety, either at home or through providing safe accommodation.		
			Winter Pressures funding has been allocated to the costs of providing		
			accommodation during cold weather to those that the council would		
			otherwise not have statutory duties to.		
			For 2025/26, Cotswold DC has been awarded £369,227 – this amount includes the Domestic Abuse New Burdens amount and other small uplifts like the		
			Winter Pressures fund previously paid separately. The MHCLG has also set		
			new conditions for the grant whereby local authorities must ensure that a		
			minimum of 49% of the fund must be spent on Prevention activities (including		
			·		
			staffing).		



Cotswold DC already utilises more than 49% of its HPG allocation on Prevention activities, so are not proposing to make any changes at this time. \*Staffing includes a CDC only Complex Needs Prevention Officer, two shared Temporary Accommodation Officers and a shared Housing Finance Officer \*\* Prevention initiative: these include, but are not limited to, providing Rent In Advance, Deposits, addressing rent shortfalls, providing white goods/flooring/essentials for homeless applicants, providing measures to keep people in their own homes such as temporary stair lifts/adaptations not covered by Disabled Facilities Grants, soundproofing, security measures and so on.
